DIGITAL WELLBEING

Education for a Connected World- Online Reputation

Children need to understand that their online actions can affect how others perceive them, and that they should be mindful of their behaviour, both now and in the future.

What can you do to support?

<u>Encourage careful posting</u>: Talk about what it means to have a "digital footprint" and encourage your child to think before posting pictures or comments. For example, if they're unsure whether something is appropriate to post, encourage them to ask you first.

<u>Discuss the concept of "delete doesn't mean gone"</u>: Teach your child that even if they delete something, others may have already seen or shared it.

Model positive behaviour: Set a good example by maintaining a positive online reputation and discussing the importance of keeping personal matters private.
