READING FOR PLEASURE

As you will all know, reading is HUGE at Gorsey Bank Primary School! It is without doubt the most important academic skill we can teach our pupils but just as important are the lessons they learn from stories and the enjoyment they get from spending time in a book either as a social or individual activity.

Every term, every year group at GBPS has their learning supported by an amazing selection of books, which make up what we call our Curriculum Bookshelves. Each book on the shelf is selected by our teachers to inspire and engage the children as well as supporting our focus on the character traits of kindness, bravery, citizenship, integrity, curiosity and gratitude (more to follow on these in next week's newsletter). The Bookshelves for all years groups are available to view on the year group pages of our website.

What can you do as parents to nurture this love of reading? Amongst many other things, model your own passion for it, make an event of visiting a bookshop (yes, possibly with a hot chocolate afterwards!) and most importantly let your child take the lead in what they want to read (we wouldn't like to be told would we?!)

...and if you make a routine of just one thing, stick unequivocally to that nightly reading slot - read to them, read with them, sit through the same book you've read 50 times if that's what they want to do! I say this as a parent and as a teacher - there are few things more significant you can do for your child (and your relationship with them) than sharing daily reading experiences - so grab a book, grab a cuppa (or whatever the drink of choice may be), get comfy and enjoy.



BOOK RECOMMENDATIONS

Picking the right book is really important but also can be very tricky! On each year group page of the school website (in the *Useful Information* section) you will find some recommendations from the team which may help. Other great sources are of course local bookshops (e.g. Simply Books in Bramhall) and libraries.
