All our children develop better being able to interact with a diverse range of people, leaving them far better equipped to empathise with the needs and backgrounds of others. This is true now but will be particularly so as they go on to embrace the challenges and opportunities of the outside world.

ANTI RACISM

Today's Wear Red Day is part of a much broader approach to antiracism both at Gorsey Bank and across Laurus Trust schools. It has been a core part of our School Development Plan for a number of years and this is backed up by Trust-wide anti-racism charters both for staff and pupils.

We are currently in the process of putting together a guidance document containing sections which summarise our curricular approach to teaching our pupils about diversity, how we as a school define racism and related terms, and also how we respond and react to the rare instances that may occur in school.

To help inform our work on this we would really appreciate the input of any parents willing to engage in this. This will take the form of an in person meeting at some point prior to the end of next term in which we will share the draft document and request thoughts and feedback on it.
